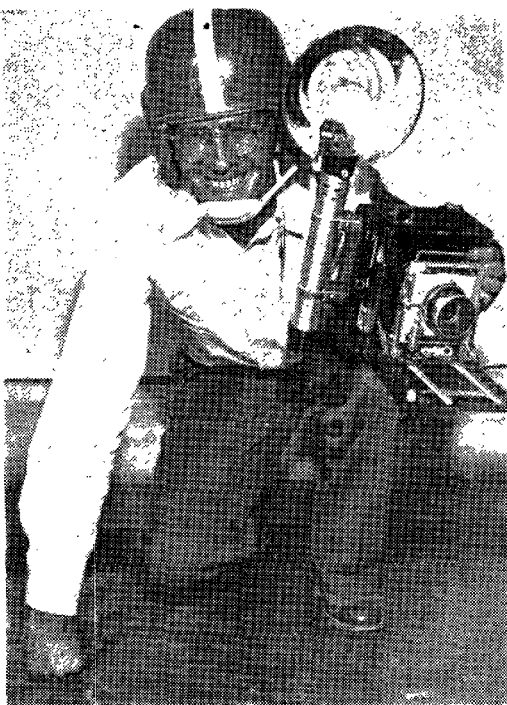


Ted Violet Winner In Football Contest
